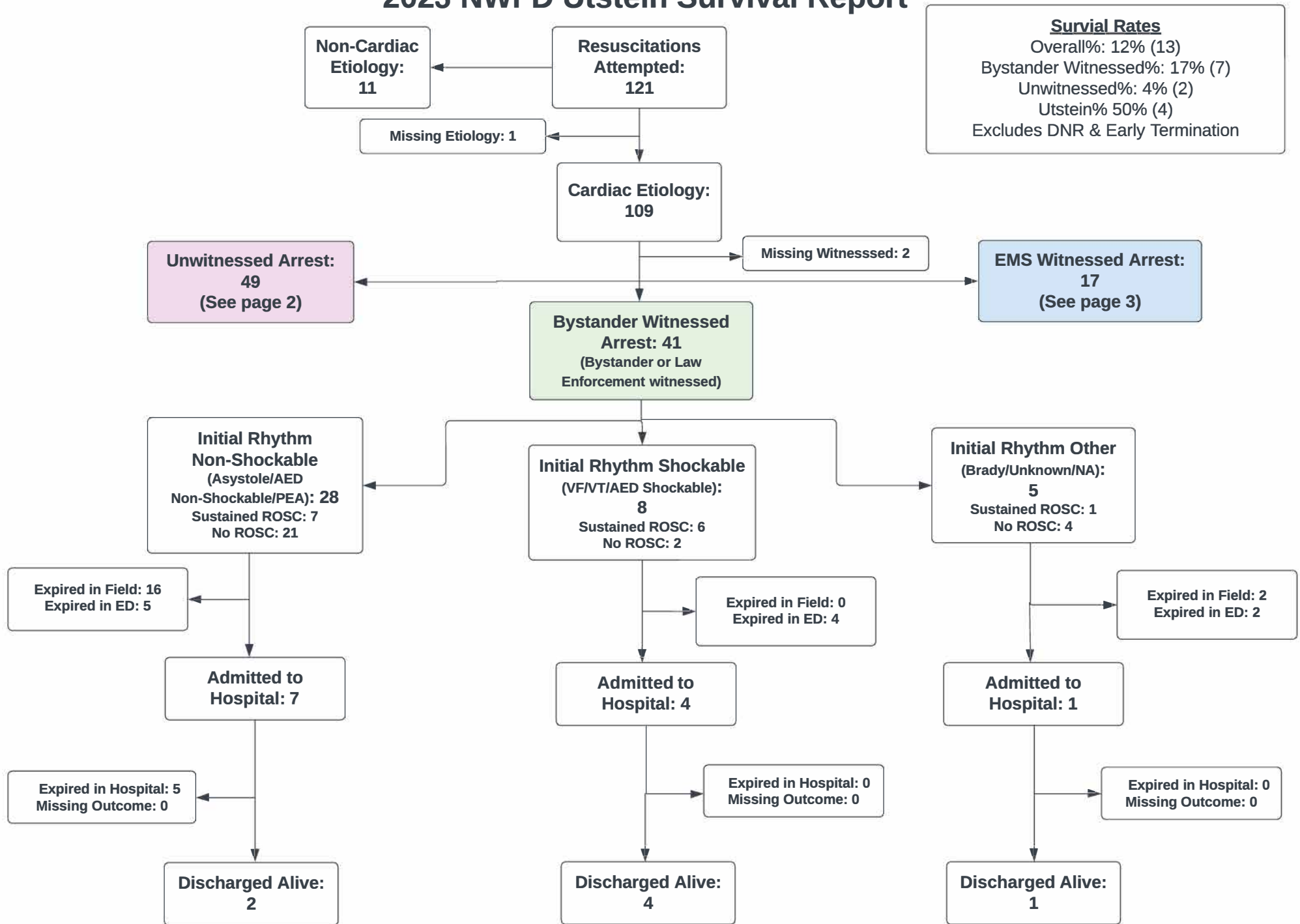

Command was terminated and BC331 RTS. |

EN334 quickly extinguished a kitchen fire that included cabinets. EN338 was assigned to perform a primary search, one dog and one cat were located. Fire was overhauled and turned over to the fire investigators. No injuries reported. |

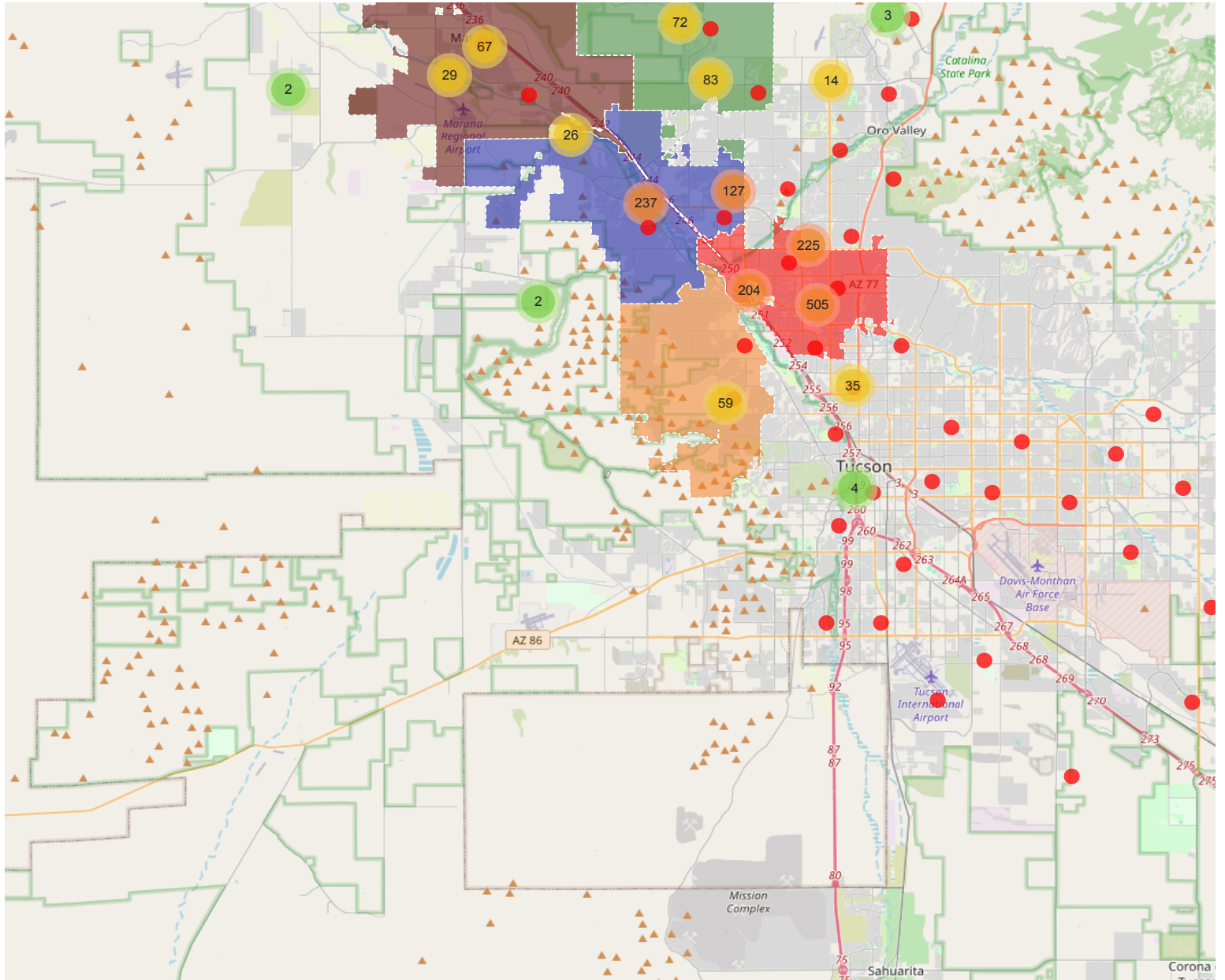

The door to the apartment was locked with no answer from within. EN333 utilized the irons to force entry into the apartment. The apartment was charged with smoke. Negative active fire was located. EN333 obtained a primary all clear and then located a fire contained inside the oven. EN333 turned the oven off, extinguished the fire with a PW can and removed the tray of burnt food outside of the apartment. EN333 cancelled the balance of the first alarm assignment.</p> <p>EN333 then opened the windows and rear porch sliding glass door and began ventilating the apartment with the aid of a PPV fan. N = 1,716 Jan 01, 2024 to Jan 31, 2024



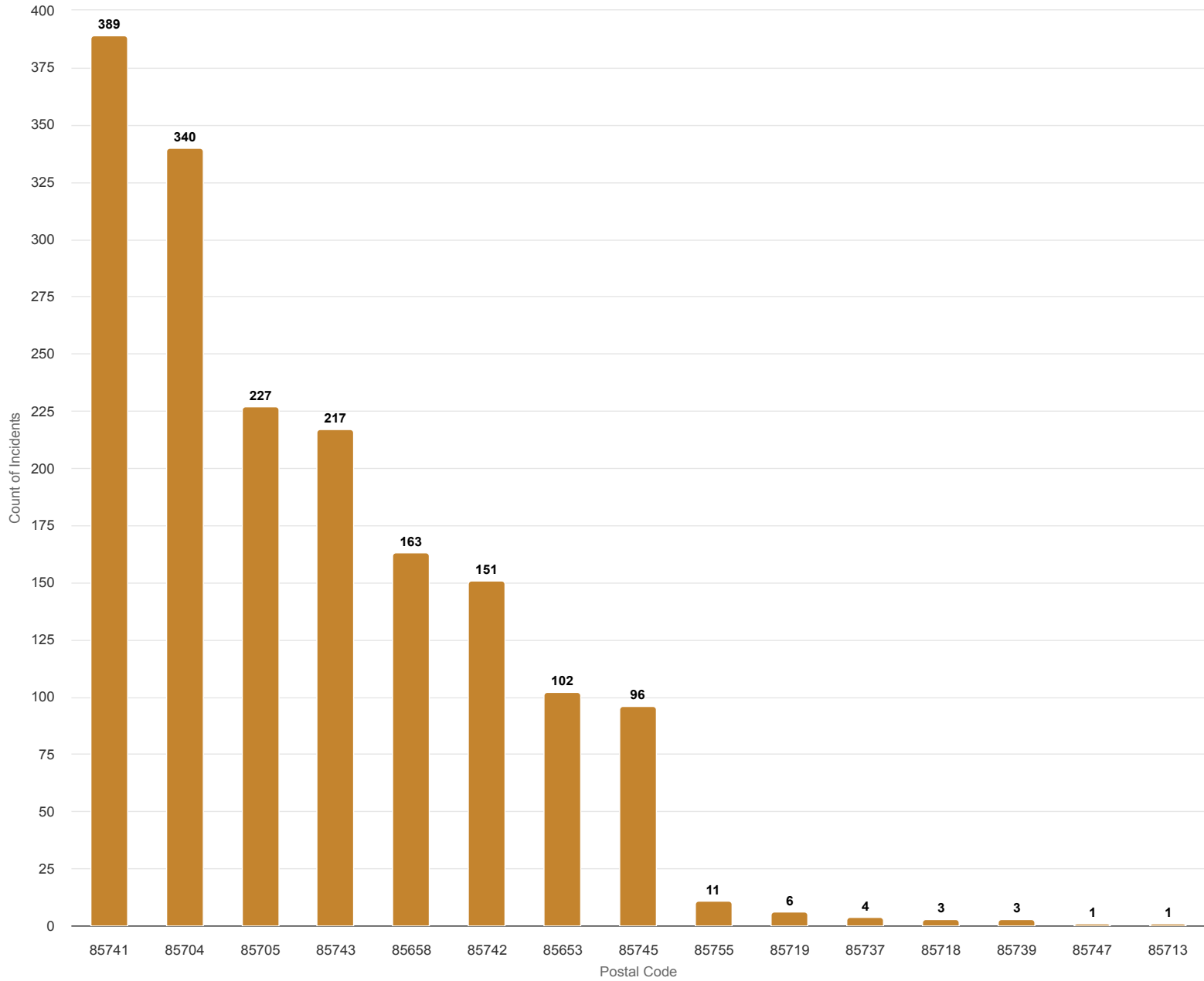

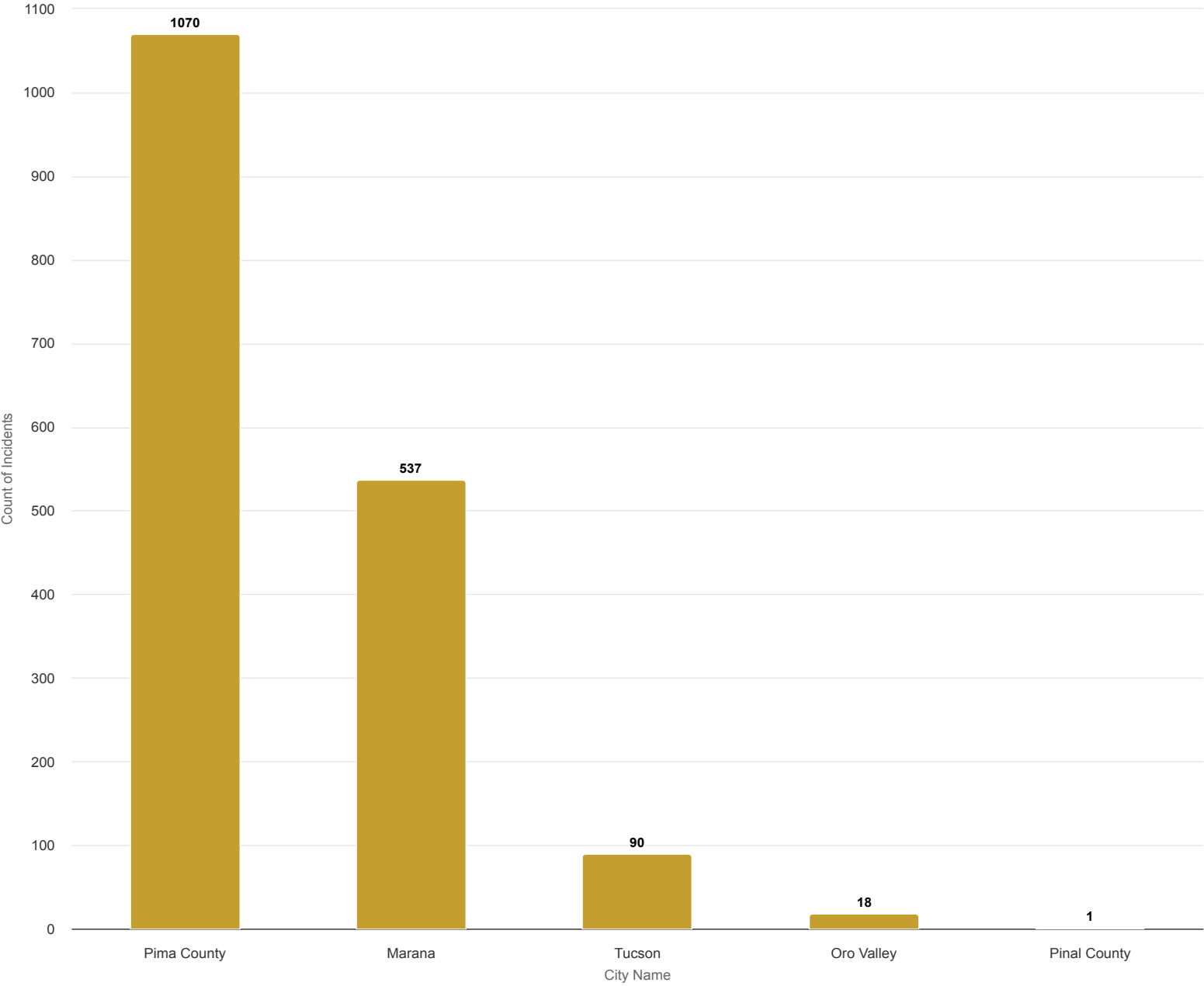
Incidents by Postal Code

Jan 01, 2024 to Jan 31, 2024



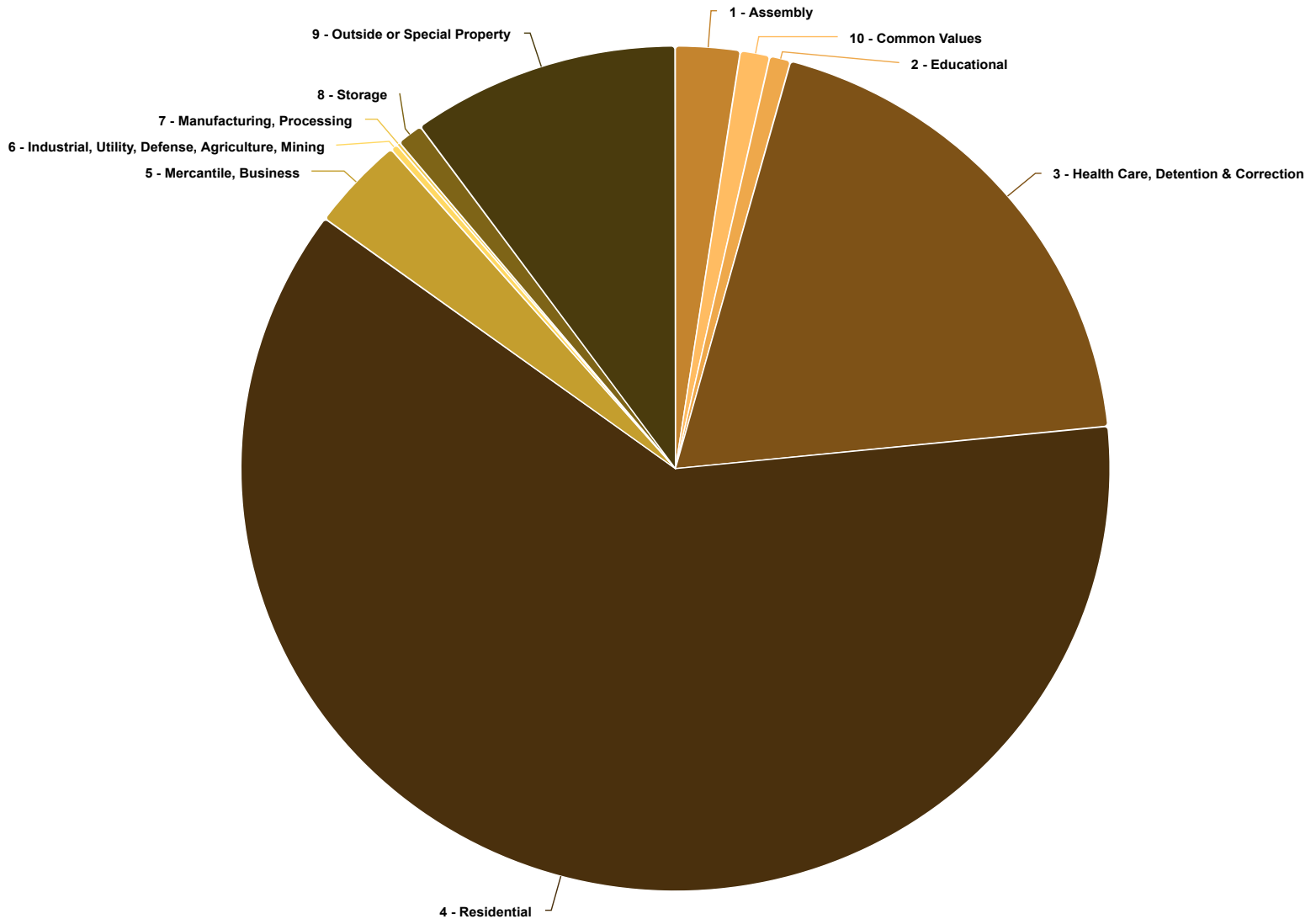
Incidents by City Name (Top 15)

Jan 01, 2024 to Jan 31, 2024



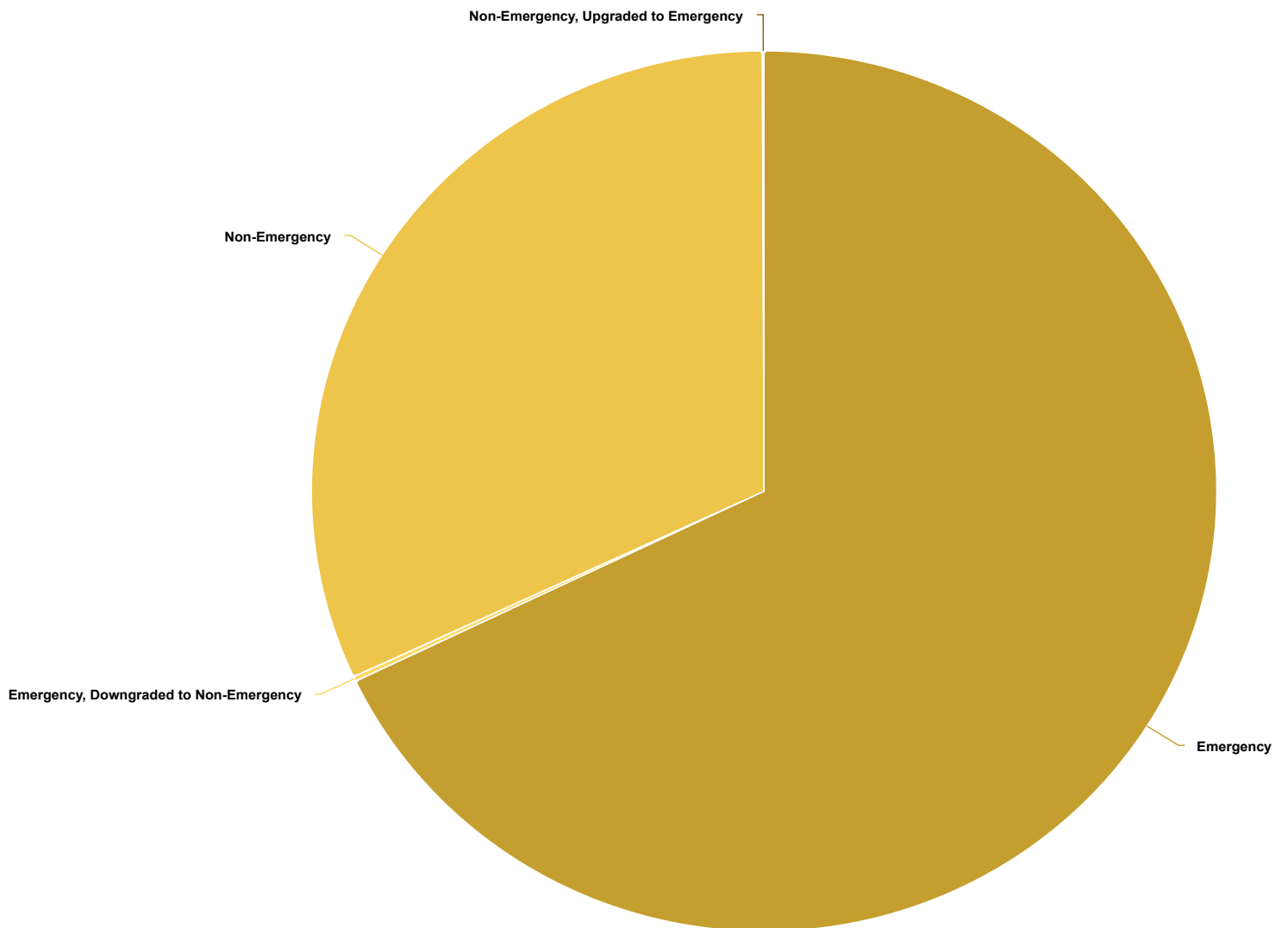
Incidents by Property Use Category

Jan 01, 2024 to Jan 31, 2024



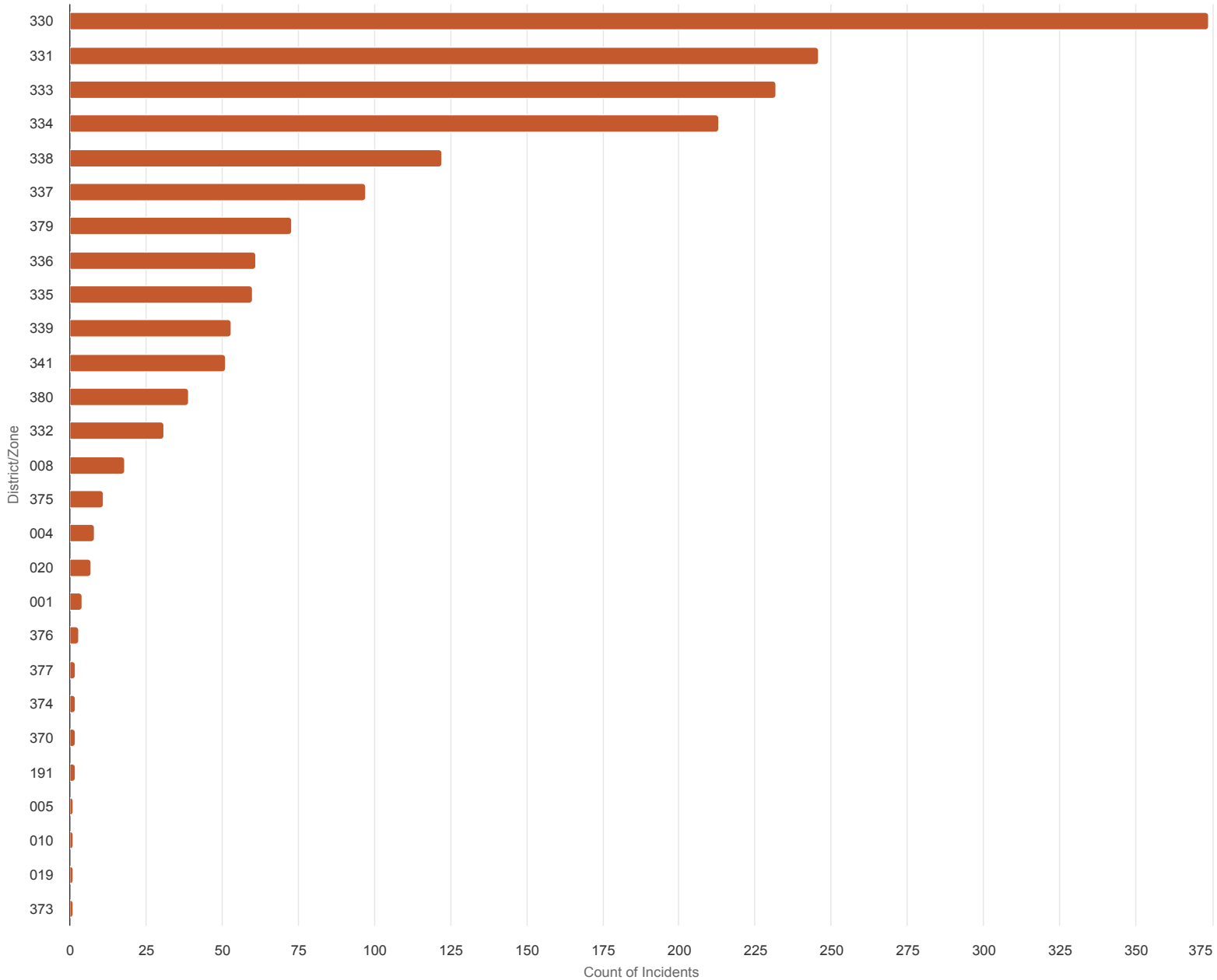
Incidents by Response Mode To Scene

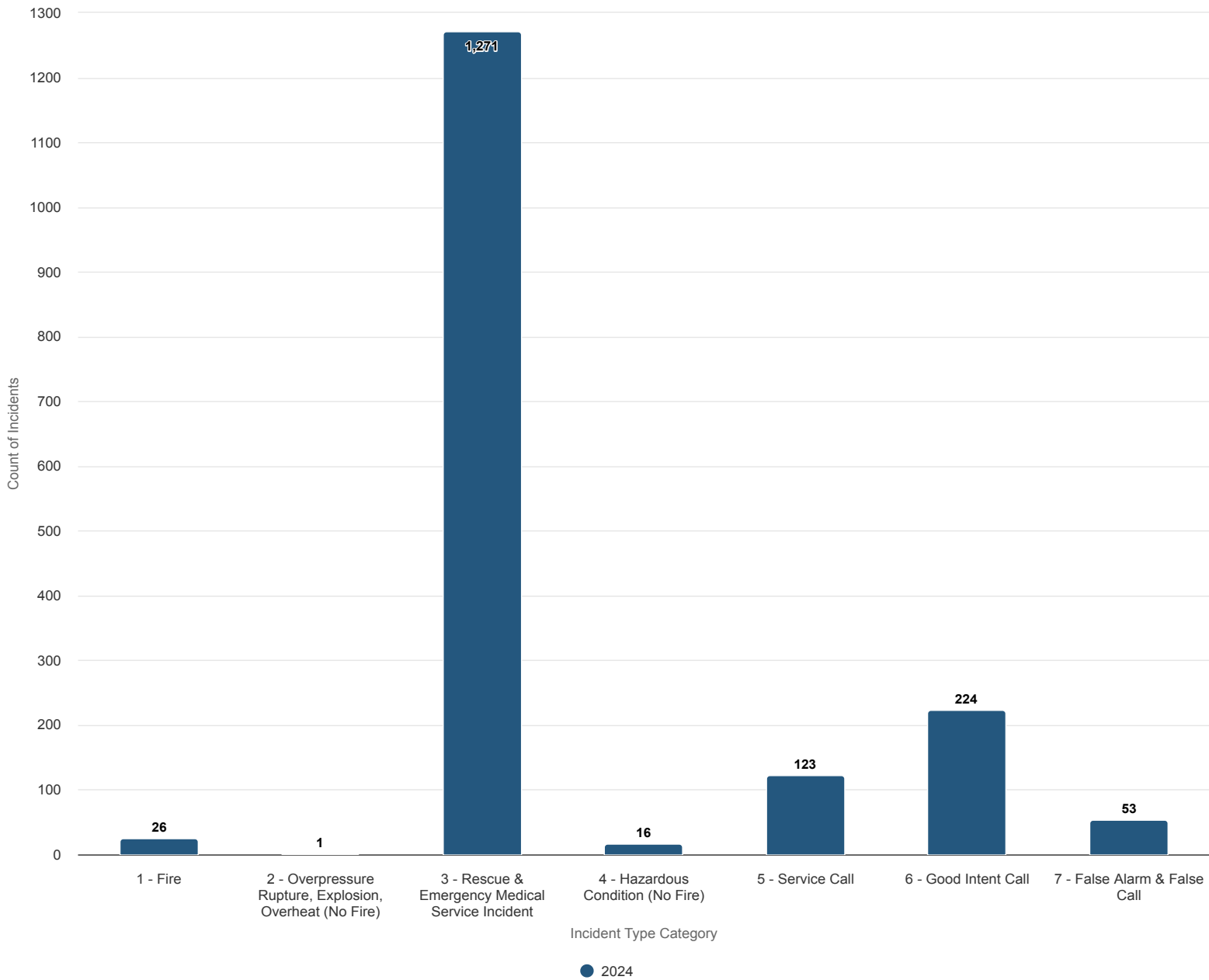

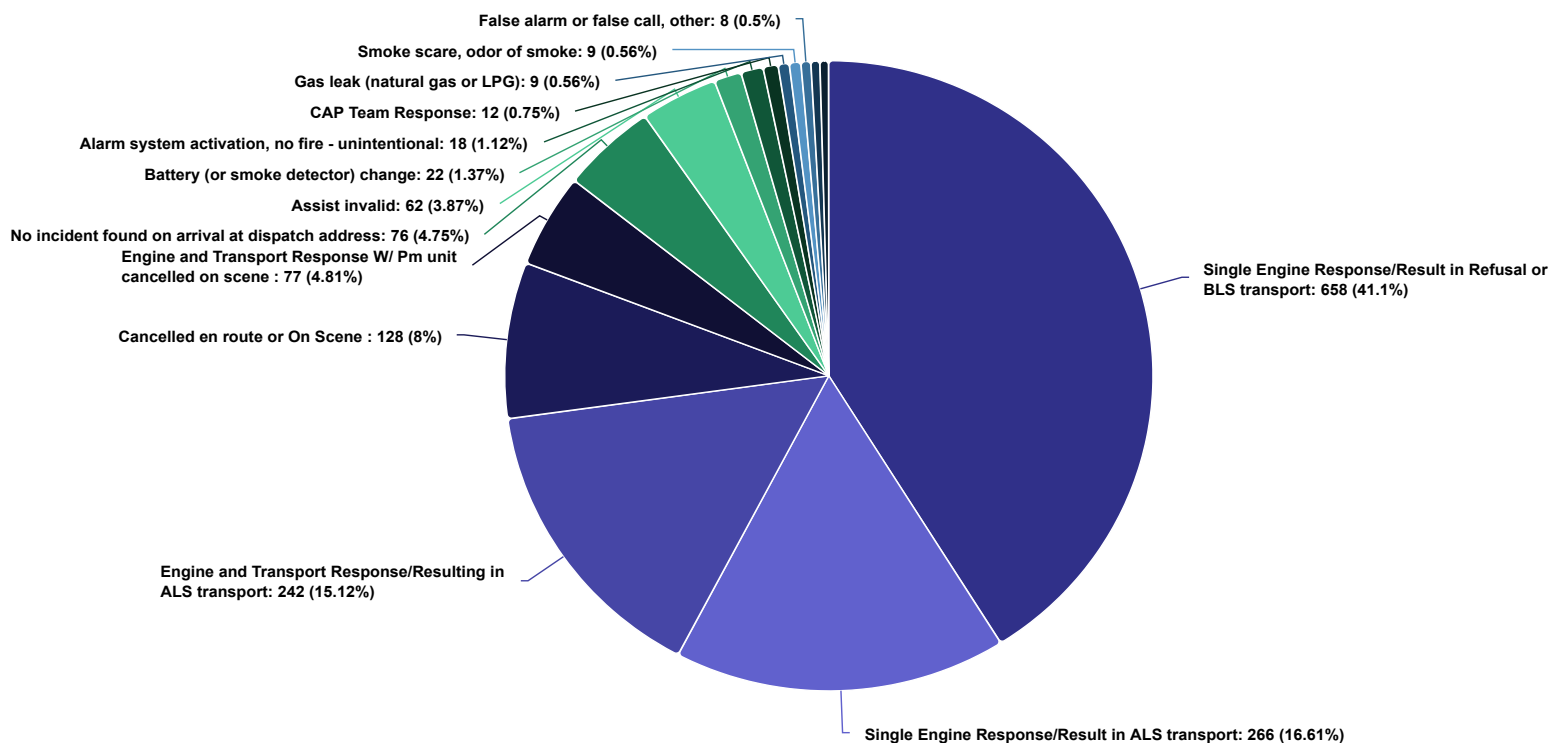
Incidents by Category and Year

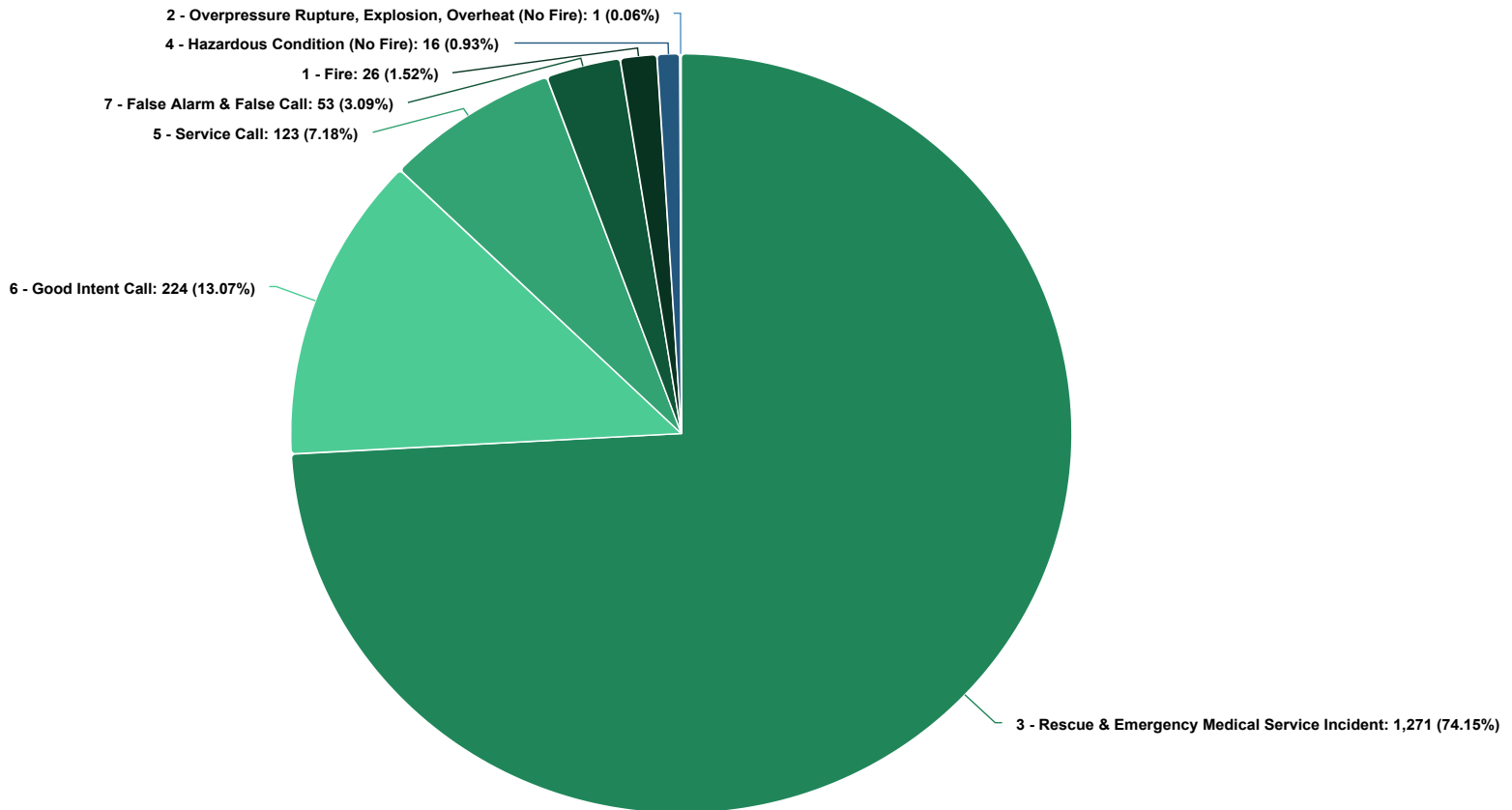
Incident Types (Top 15)

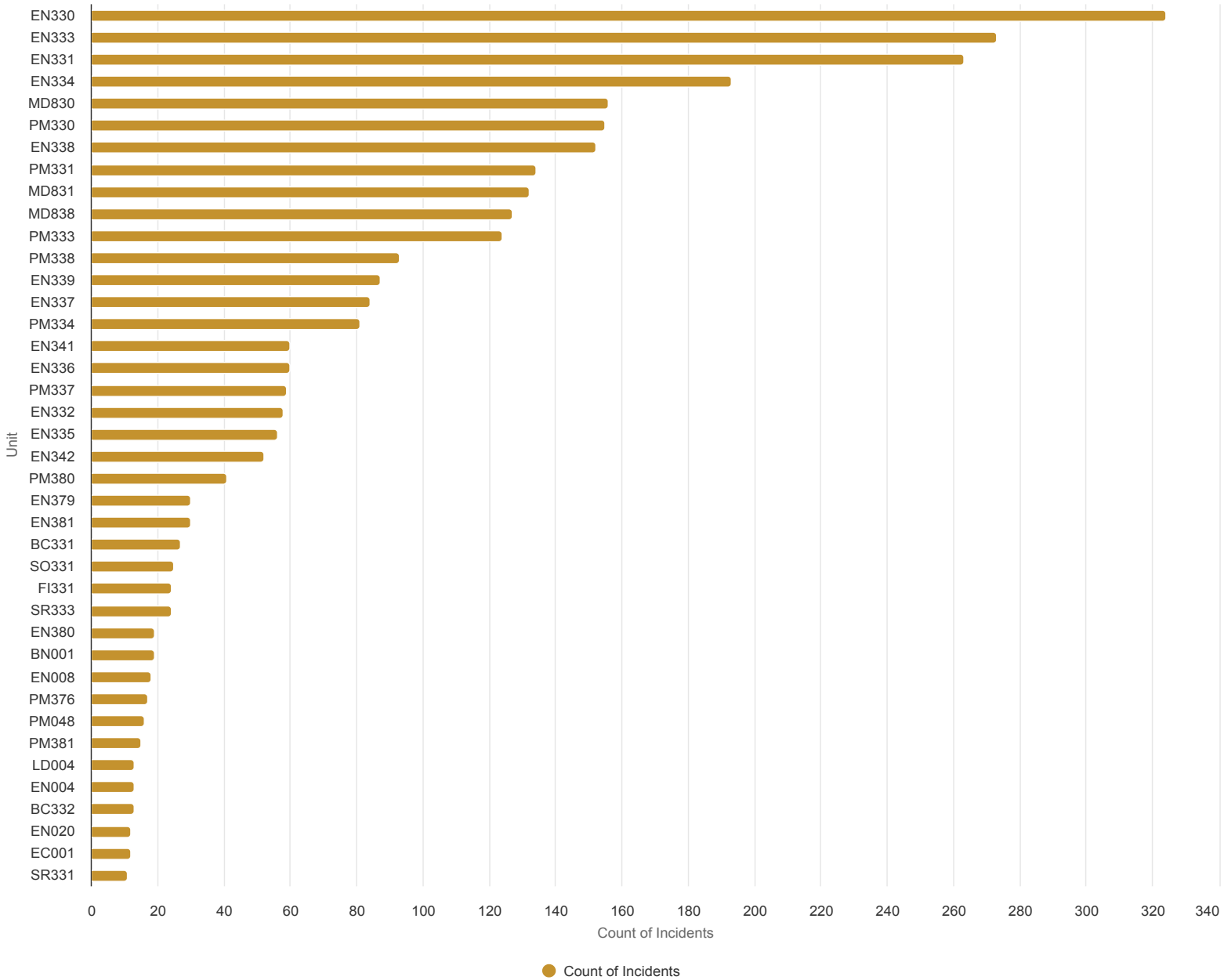

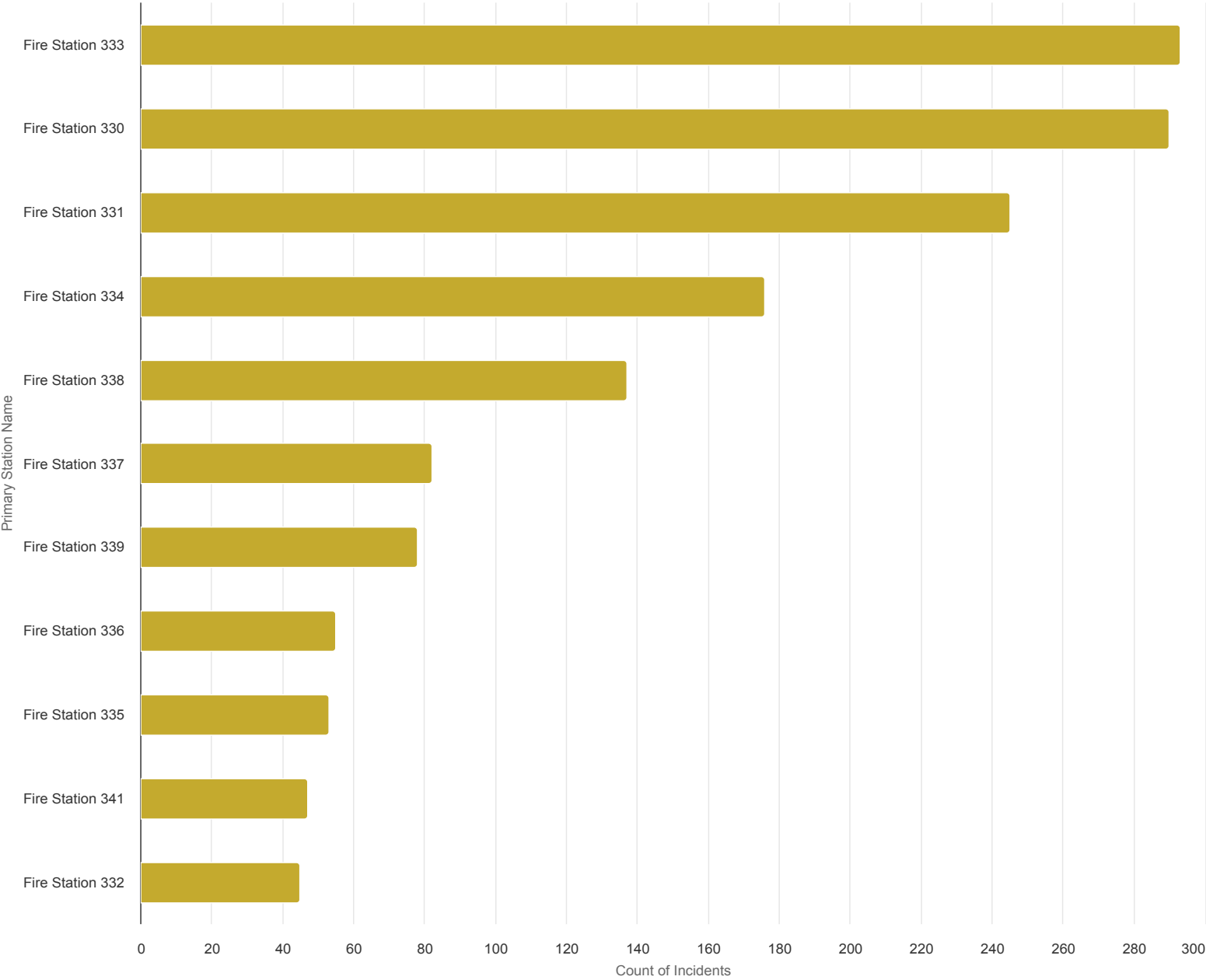
Incidents by Apparatus Resource ID (Top 40)

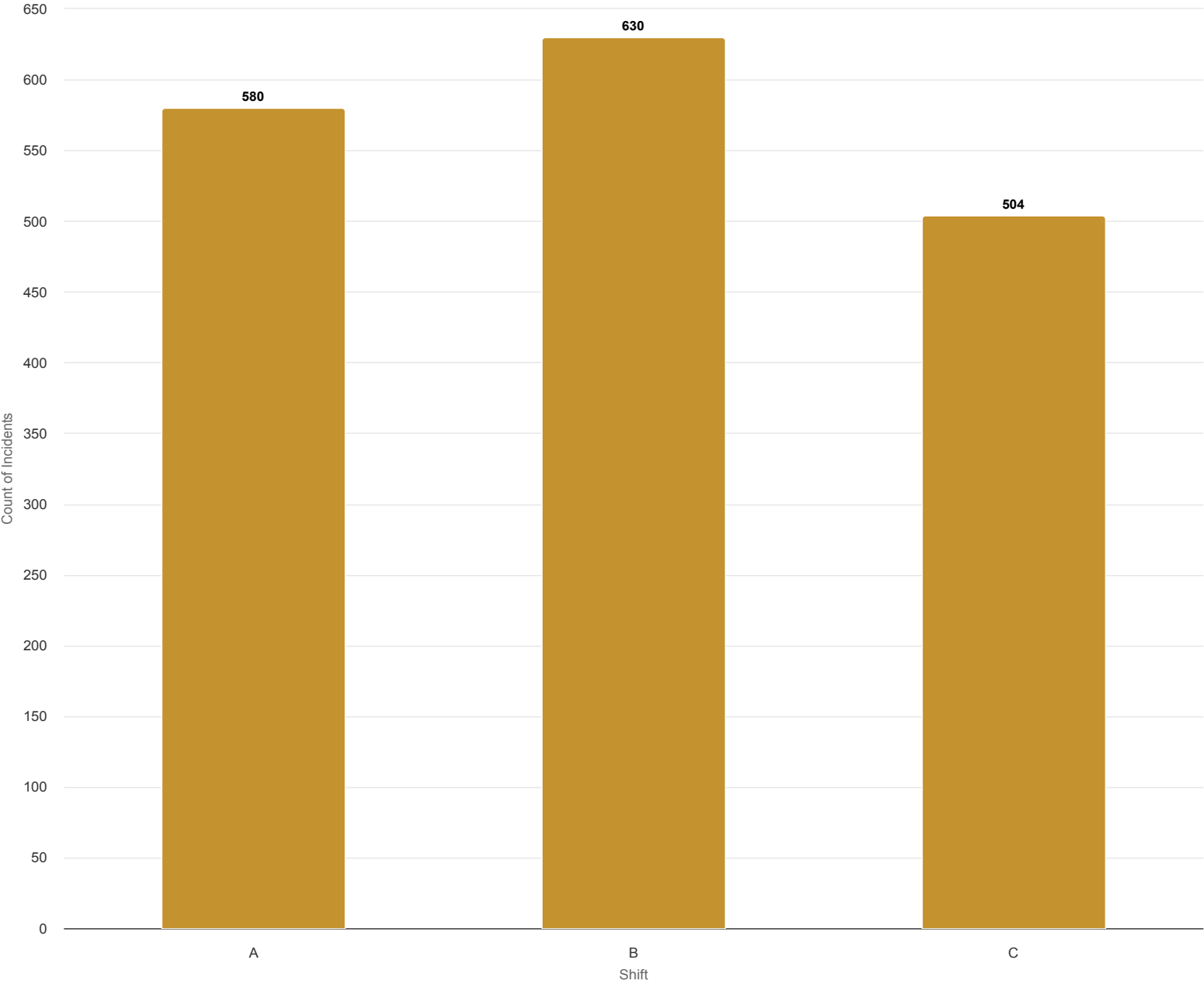

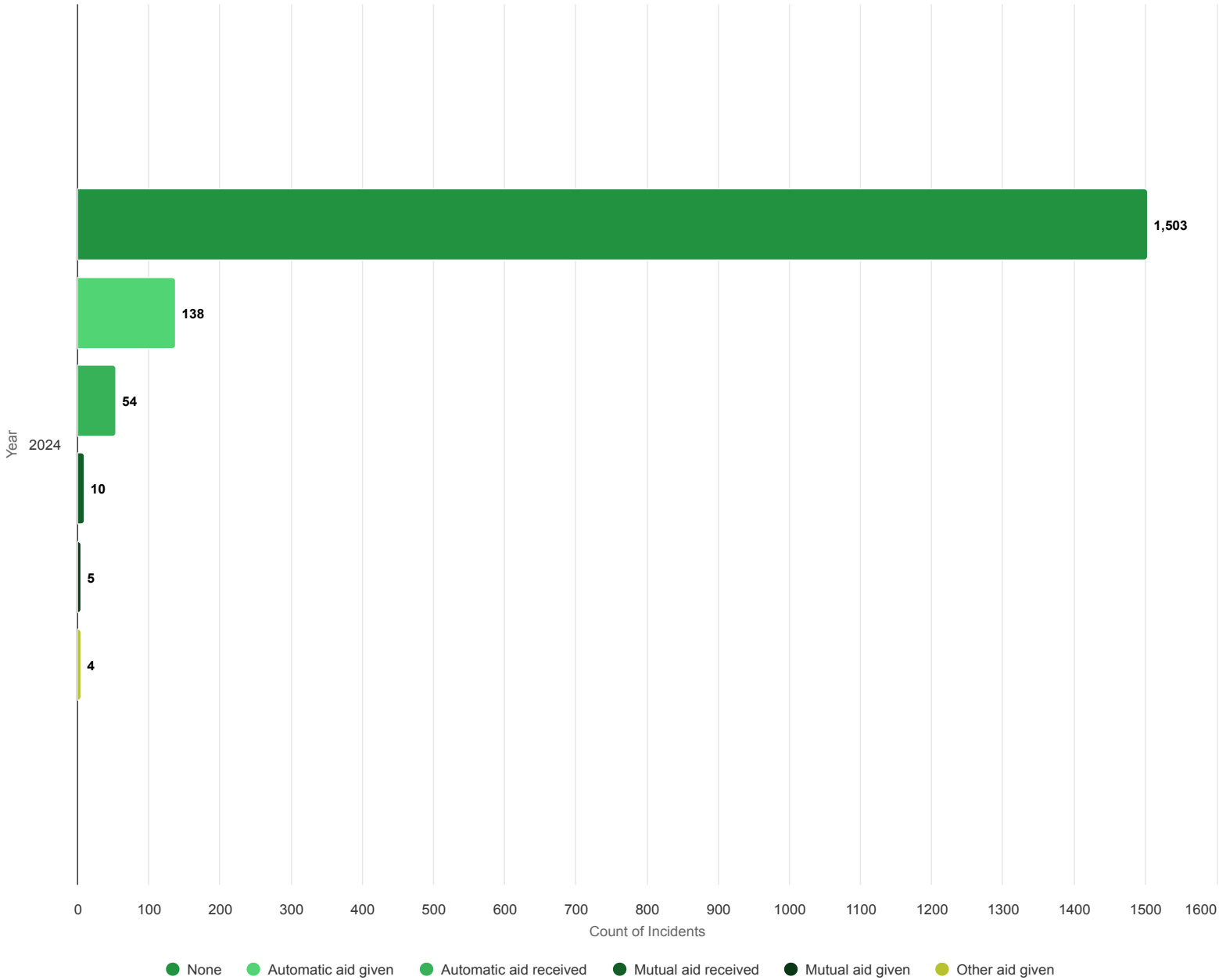
